Update/progress on agency initiatives

The web page www.LouisianaAnswers.com continues to be updated and looking for information that can assist citizens who need information regarding Respite Care or other information and resources. This site offers information on a variety of services and links regarding where families may find information or agencies that provide services.

From July 2014 – November 2014, the **Adult and Disability Resource Centers** received calls 3,849 clients reported they have one or more disabilities. The types of services that were requested were: information on public and private long term care planning, transportation, dental care, wheelchair ramps, home repair, housing, Medicaid services, Medicare Part D assistance, Alzheimer's disease, health insurance, pharmaceutical assistance, congregate meals, respite care and options counseling.

The Governor's Office of Elderly Affairs received a No Wrong Door planning grant in September 2014 and will be working with the Office of Aging and Adult Services to set up stakeholder meetings. This grant will develop a three year plan to submit at the end of the one year grant period.
